We visited two locations - **The Panchayat Bhawan,** and **Primary School.**

The motto of this visit was to put a light on different topics and assess there awareness and problems faced by the villagers.

Purpose of Visit :- Acquainted them about Dengue, Malaria, Oral Hygiene , Menstrual Hygiene and the various facilities provide by Era's Lucknow Medical College and Hospital .



1. How It Has Been Planned:

The Outreach Awareness Program in Mubarakpur was meticulously planned by the Department of MHA (Master of Healthcare Administration) , ELMCH . This program aimed to bridge the gap between urban healthcare services and rural communities. The program's planning was marked by meticulous attention to detail and a focus on ensuring that it served the needs of the local community. The participants in this initiative included MHA 2nd-year students, who brought academic knowledge and real-world insights to the table, and MHA interns, who played an instrumental role in executing the program effectively.

2. What Have Been Done:

The Outreach Awareness Program comprised sessions at two vital locations in Mubarakpur. These sessions were strategically structured to deliver critical information and knowledge to the local residents, both young and old.

• *Panchayat Bhawan Session:*

The Panchayat Bhawan served as the initial focal point of our outreach efforts. Approximately 20-30 rural individuals gathered here to participate in our informative sessions. Our primary aim was to create awareness about the various **medical services offered by ELMCH**, an institution that stands as a beacon of hope for healthcare services in the region. We believe that for communities to access the care they need, they first must be aware that such services exist, and that's precisely what we sought to achieve. Furthermore, the program addressed critical aspects of personal and public health.

MHA (Interns)educate the attendees on **oral hygiene** practices. highlighting the importance of regular dental check-ups and proper tooth-brushing techniques. We also delved into the subject of **menstrualhygiene**, providing essential guidance for the women in the audience. Additionally, we addressed **prevalent diseases**(dengue, typhoid, viral fever)in the area, creating awareness about symptoms and preventive measures.

- *Primary School Session:*

Our second session unfolded in a local primary school, where we were met with the eager faces of 30-40 children. This demographic represents the future of Mubarakpur, and it was a privilege to engage with them. The focus here was on imparting knowledge about fundamental hygiene practices. We started with an interactive demonstration of proper **tooth-brushing techniques**. By engaging the children in hands-on learning, we ensured thatthey comprehended the importance of dental health and acquired the skills necessary to maintain it.

In addition to oral hygiene, we emphasised the significance of **hand hygiene**, especially in the context of the ongoing global health challenges. Proper handwashing and sanitising techniques were taught, and the children actively participated in these demonstrations. Our aim was to instil lifelong habits that would contribute to their overall health and well-being.

Conclusion:-

The Outreach Awareness Program in Mubarakpur was not merely an event; it was a catalyst for positive change in the community. By taking healthcare education to the doorsteps of rural residents, we empowered them with essential knowledge about the services available to them at ELMCH.
