"I dedicate this award to my mother, brothers, sister and brother-in- law, all of whom cooperated with my father all through his climb to success. It is true that for being successful, one requires family cooperation and my father did receive it. I hope others take inspiration from his life and work and walk on the path he showed to the community," he added.
